

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF USE FOR THE WEBSITE « THE SPOILER ROLEX PARIS MASTERS »

INTRODUCTION

The present Terms and Conditions of Use (the « **T&C** ») apply without restriction or reserve to the services offered by the French Tennis Federation (the « **FFT** ») on the website « The Spoiler Rolex Paris Masters » (the « **Website** »).

The Website is accessible and available to visit at the following web address: <https://thespoiler.rolexparismasters.com>.

The Website is published by the FFT, an association governed by the French law of 1901 and recognised as having a public purpose (business identification/SIRET number: 775 671 381 000 33), registered under the number 9242, and with its registered office address at Stade Roland-Garros – 2, avenue Gordon Bennett – 75016 Paris, FRANCE (Telephone: +33 (1).47.43.48.00. / Fax: +33 (0)1.47.43.04.94.).

The Publishing Director of the Website is Mr Alain FISCHER, in his capacity as Secretary General of the FFT. The Editorial Manager of the Website is Ms Nathalie RICARD DEFFONTAINE, in her capacity as Director of Communications and Digital Transformation.

The Website is hosted by NFRANCE CONSEIL, a simplified joint-stock company with a capital of 200.164,00 euros, registered with the Trade and Companies Register of Toulouse under the number B 425 052 941, and with its registered office address at 9 rue Ritay 31000 Toulouse.

Article 1 - Presentation of the Website

The Website is a digital platform dedicated to « The Spoiler » contest, whose aim is to promote the Rolex Paris Masters tournament. In this regard, the Website offers access to the contest, the explanations about how it works and the daily results.
